When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his

hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. ³⁰ Aaron and all the people of Israel saw Moses, and behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses talked with them. ³² Afterward all the people of Israel came near, and he commanded them all that the LORD had spoken with him in Mount Sinai. ³³ And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face. ³⁴ Whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would remove the veil, until he came out. And when he came out and told the people of Israel what he was commanded, ³⁵ the people of Israel would see the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face was shining. And Moses would put the veil over his face again, until he went in to speak with him.



And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ In their case

the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Matthew 17:1-4 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters--one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

IT IS GOOD FOR US TO BE HERE

Have you even tried to look at the combination of snow and the brightness of the sun? It usually gives me a very painful headache. In the book of Exodus we read Moses had gone up on the top of Mount Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments from the LORD. But the LORD only allowed Moses while in the cleft of a rock to see His back, and not His face or full glory. The Gospel of Mark gives us another impressive description of Jesus' transfiguration when he says that His garments were "shining, exceedingly white, like snow, such as no launderer on earth can whiten them." The brightness of Jesus' garments alone would have been enough to kill them if it were God's will. It is no wonder and no surprise that in the midst of all the excitement and emotion of this miraculous event that Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters--one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

Think of Peter, James, and John. They had front row seats to what was happening. Just as quickly as Jesus' had been transfigured, "... there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus." Certainly two Old Testament "all-stars" had just come into view. Questions arise like: How did the disciples know it was Moses and Elijah? They lived hundreds of years before them. How did Moses and Elijah appear there with Jesus even though they hadn't lived on the earth for such a long time? Both Moses and Elijah were taken into heaven in two very unique ways. God had buried Moses, and God had taken Elijah by a chariot of fire! Many questions, one answer. Don't make your God too small! In other words, what He tells us has happened, He is certainly able to perform! He keeps His promises.

Recognize that when we sit with Jesus and His Word, we see through the eyes of faith what we will see in our flesh (Job 19) when Jesus returns to take us home to heaven! "I was glad when they said to me, let us go into the house of the LORD!" (Psalm 122:1). And then let us say with those first disciples also, "It is good, Lord Jesus, for us to be here!"

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Feb.28-March 5, '22

- **Mon Exodus 34:29-35** God chose a simple way to impress Moses and His people with His holiness, and Moses' sun-shiny face did the job. Whenever Moses and God met person-to-person ("face-to-face") inside the tabernacle, the veil was off, but when he came outside, Moses used the veil as a shield to protect the eyesight of his congregation. That's symbolic; stay tuned.
- **Tues Luke 9:28-36** Jesus outshined Moses in more ways than one, for He is God incarnate. On this occasion His deity shone like sunshine, and God's heavenly heroes Moses and Elijah honored Him also. That was already more than Peter could fathom, and it was even more stupefying to hear the voice of Almighty God directing them to listen up when Jesus had something to say. [Jesus is still with us in His Word, keep listening!]
- Wed 2 Corinthians 3:7-18 Moses administered God's Law, glorious in its own way. Contrariwise, God's grace in Christ Jesus is more glorious. Those who face God via Moses are dazzled by the Law and blind to Jesus, the Messiah revealed in God's Old Testament. After his conversion Paul dumped soul-servitude to the Law (which is a lost cause) and instead devoted his life to serving the gospel, God's glorious answer to sin.
- **Thurs 2 Samuel 12:1-13** Who dared confront King David with his sins—and hope to survive? A man of God with enough love to run the risk, apparently. David was already feeling rotten (Ps. 32:3-4; Ps. 38:1-8) about his sins, so via pastor Nathan, God touched him gently. Now, what caused David to explode (5)? Well, he did so because he was Law-oriented, as a king and judge is apt to be. It took him a while to digest God's mercy, which he needed all along.
- **Fri Luke 8:9-14** Did Jesus avoid confrontation? Nope. He loved people enough to face them with the truth about themselves. God can humble the self-righteous/proud sinner—so that He can embrace the repentant sinner. It's a good parable, but where do we fit? Sometimes we are proud of ourselves, and sometimes we are ashamed of ourselves. Jesus, help us!
- Sat 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:2 God determined to end the war with humanity and declare truce—so that humans can trash their battle gear and face God without fear of reprisal or punishment. It takes some convincing, of course, and God's good-will ambassadors do their best to get the message across. The real crux is to convince wary ex-enemies that the treaty is authentic, on the grounds that it has been signed in Jesus' blood (20-21). God has been gracious enough to save you and me and our neighbors across the globe, declaring an end to the warfare and assurance of peace with our Creator. Praise God our Savior!
