

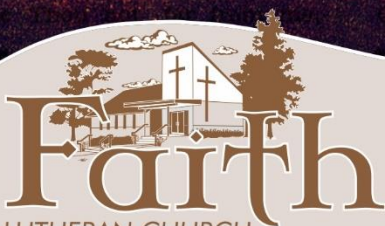

Luke 13:31-35

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." ³² And he said to them, "Go and tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I finish my course.' ³³ Nevertheless, I must go on my way today and tomorrow and

the day following, for it cannot be that a prophet should perish away from Jerusalem.' ³⁴ O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! ³⁵ Behold, your house is forsaken. And I tell you, you will not see me until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!'"

Philippians 3:17-4:1

Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us. ¹⁸ For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. ¹⁹ Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself. ¹ Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

Psalm 42

When shall I come and appear before God? ³ My tears have been my food day and night, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" ⁴ These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival. ⁵ Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation ⁶ and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar. ⁷ Deep calls to deep at the roar of your waterfalls; all your breakers and your waves have gone over me. ⁸ By day the LORD commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. ⁹ I say to God, my rock: "Why have you forgotten me? Obedient Ears

Isaiah 50:5 (ESV) *The Lord GOD has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious; I turned not backward.*

"Great listener! Follows instructions well!" How would you like to find those evaluations scrawled on your child's report card? Such a review would surely bring you a sigh of relief. This would certainly be preferable to "Inattentive. Likes to have the last word." What would be scrawled on your report card if God was writing it? Perhaps it would say, "*Your ears are open, but you do not listen.*" (Isaiah 42:20)

Unlistening ears characterize a person who does not follow orders. When it comes to the demands of God's Law, isn't that exactly what we do daily? How often do you ignore God's clearly written will, making the excuses, "Just one more time," or, "I'll start doing better tomorrow," or even, "It doesn't matter, I know He'll forgive me anyways." In other words, we *hear* what God says, but we don't always *listen*.

Christ's ears were open, and He listened. This fact indicated that He would do exactly as He had been instructed by His Father. He would not turn backward. Even when His Father's will was that He drink the cup of suffering by dying on the cross, Jesus listened and obeyed. As the perfect listener, He received this glowing review from His Father, "*This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.*" (Matthew 17:5b)



What would the Father put on your report card? Thanks to Christ, it's not what you deserve! As your substitute, Jesus reversed your deafness. His obedience is counted as yours. The Father now gives this evaluation: "*Well done, good and faithful servant.*" (Matthew 25:23)

Christ, thank you for Your obedience in my place. Open my ears to listen to You. Amen.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; March 14-19, '22

Mon Jeremiah 26:8-16 The clergy opposed Jeremiah because he threatened their status, and so they ganged up on him. Jeremiah did not cave in, for God had given him a holy assignment. When the civil authorities were called in, Jeremiah explained God's plan all over again, and they sided with Jeremiah. A good first step. Note: Having skin in the game can make a person biased and on the wrong side of God's enterprise. Lord, have mercy!

Tues Luke 13:31-35 These Pharisees may have had ulterior motives in urging Jesus to get out of town, for Jesus sent them back to their boss to report that He was not intimidated. Rather, He asserted that He would take no shortcuts from reaching His goal of *being perfected* (31-33) via Calvary and the empty tomb. The window of opportunity was closing on Herod, Pharisees, and all Jewry—and who would be the loser? They, not Jesus (34-35).

Wed Philippians 3:17-4:1 *Walking* happens when we take one balanced step after another, moving forward. Here the Apostle Paul encourages us to walk in tandem with other Christians—sharing our balance and stride with others, somewhat like partners in a three-legged gunnysack race. We learn to copy one another's good steps as we march forward together. "I walk with Jesus all the way; my walk is heavenward all the way." We belong together.

Thurs Jeremiah 26:17-24 Some old-timers had gone through the drill before, and from at least one case they had learned that when people repent, God relents (1). People don't always repent, of course, and that brought to mind another case that ended badly for the prophet (20-23). Now, what about Jeremiah? His case would have ended badly, too, except that Ahikam, prince of Judah, intervened and took Jeremiah into protective custody (24).

Fri Matthew 23:34-39 Every Hebrew knew Zechariah's significance, and true Israelies shuddered at the barbarism of his assassins, who murdered this servant of God while he was conducting a worship service in church! Jerusalem was rotten to the core, and Jesus tried over and over to rescue its people from hellfire. Lord, have mercy on our rotting world, too!

Sat Colossians 2:6-10 and Philippians 3:17-21 in poetic form: (TLH: 413)

My walk is heavenward all the way; Await, my soul, the morrow,
When thou shalt find release for aye From all thy sin and sorrow.

All worldly pomp, be gone! To heaven I now press on.
