LUTHER'S EVENING PRAYER

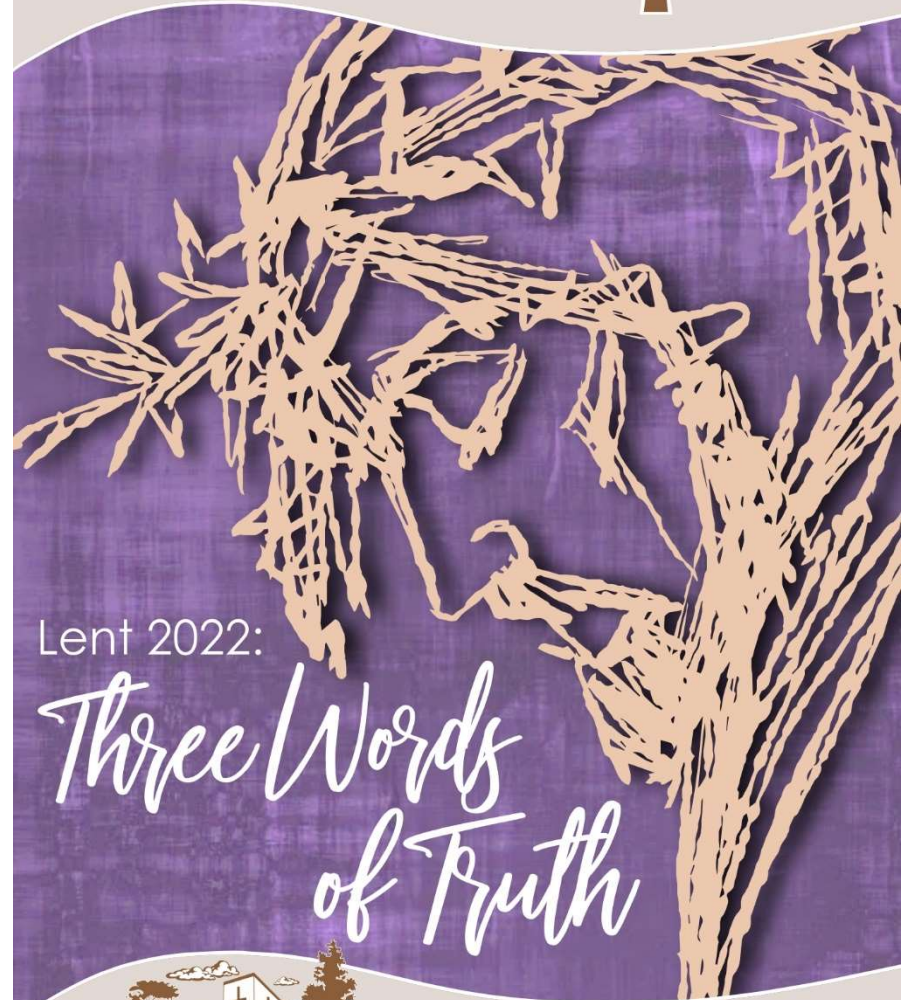
C In the name of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

✠ The Sermon ✠

John 19:14-18

(NIV) It was the day of Preparation of the Passover; it was about noon. “Here is your king,” Pilate said to the Jews. ¹⁵ But they shouted, “Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!” “Shall I crucify your king?” Pilate asked. “We have no king but Caesar,” the chief priests answered. ¹⁶ Finally Pilate handed him over to them to be crucified. So the soldiers took charge of Jesus. ¹⁷ Carrying his own cross, he went out to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgotha). ¹⁸ There they crucified him, and with him two others— one on each side and Jesus in the middle.

Three Words of Truth: “Take Him Away!”
