Christopher Joseph Fletcher, age 62 of New Douglas, IL, formerly of St. Louis, MO, born November 6, 1959 in Kirkwood, MO, passed away on Tuesday, September 20, 2022 at Anderson Hospital in Maryville, IL.

Chris was born and raised in the St. Louis area. He was the second youngest of four children born to William and Marilyn Fletcher.

1st Scripture Reading

"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. ² In my Father's house are many rooms. 2nd Scripture Reading
