"For behold, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all

evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. ² But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall. ³ And you shall tread down the wicked, for they will be ashes under the soles of your feet, on the day when I act, says the LORD of hosts. ⁴ "Remember the law of my servant Moses, the statutes and rules that I commanded him at Horeb for all Israel. ⁵ "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes. ⁶ And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction."

Devotion: "Not Me!"

"Who left the towel on the bathroom floor?" "Who left the garage door open?" We all know the usual answer: "Not me!" We don't like to assume blame for something wrong or something that didn't work out quite the way we intended it to. After a heated argument have you said, "If I hurt you, I'm sorry"? It sounds good, but really, isn't saying, "if" avoiding accountability too? Wouldn't taking full responsibility be saying, "I hurt you and I'm sorry. Please forgive me"? It's tempting to claim that it's always someone else's fault: a parent, spouse, a boss with unrealistic expectations, a society which doesn't care about me. Taking it a step further is denying accountability before God: "God can't condemn me for my attitude and lifestyle. He made me this way."

"Not me!" does not excuse anyone from having to answer for their words and actions. Blaming others for one's own laziness or mistakes only compounds the guilt. Making excuses to God is true foolishness since He sees right through our words and actions to the motives of the heart. "O LORD, you have searched me and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar" (Ps. 139:1).

To those who think they can escape God's notice and avoid answering for their lives, Paul says, "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Cor. 5:10). We have no excuse for a single sin. "If we say, 'We have no sin,' we are deceiving ourselves, and the truth is not in us" (1 Jn. 1:8). Praise God for the Savior, who instead of shifting blame to someone else, took on Himself the sin of all humankind and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice! "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 Jn. 1:9).

Instead of foolishly trying to make ourselves look better than we are, let's humbly confess our faults to the Lord and to those around us whom we hurt. Let's trust in Jesus' righteousness, not our own, when God calls us to give an account. Then whether the final judgment is today or in the distant future, we have nothing to hide and nothing to fear.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Nov. 07 - 12, '22

Mon Luke 6:20-23 Man looks on the outward appearance, and sees the poor, the hungry, the weeping, the hated. Jesus has a forward look which even now brings great joy. "Blessed are you!" As we approach the end of another year, may it be with the forward look, "for behold, your reward is great in heaven" (v23).

Tues Hebrews 11:32-40 The saints of old did great things and suffered great things, but the distinguishing mark in all of them was their forward-looking faith in Christ, the gift with more promise than anything else in the world.

Wed Revelation 21:1-6 When God came to see our first parents in the Garden of Eden (Gn3), they hid from Him in fear, but in the new heaven and new earth, God's dwelling place is with mankind, and His presence brings joy and every blessing in Christ, the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end (cp22:13).

Thurs Luke 20:27-38 Jesus was approached by some who thought the promise of resurrection was foolishness, and tried to make it look so with an extended example of a widow remarrying. Jesus points out that the resurrection we look forward to is to a new life, not the same world we left behind. To show that there is a resurrection, He quotes from Moses to show that even after the patriarch believers had died, the LORD at the burning bush called Himself their God.

Fri Revelation 22:1-5 The angel shows John the new heaven and earth using images which the Scriptures and our present life have made familiar to us: a river, the water of life, bright as crystal, the throne of God, the Lamb, the tree of life, worshipers belonging to God the original source of light (cpGn1:3).

Sat Isaiah 65:17-25 The prophet looks forward to a world in which the taint of sin and all its effects are no more to be found. This is the kingdom of God and of His Christ, which shall continue to be a joy forever, free from all hurt and destruction, says the LORD! (v 25)
