Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Dec. 26 – 31, '22

Mon Matthew 1:18-23 The events we celebrate at Christmas were brought about by God Himself. An angel of God was sent to Joseph to guide him in carrying through on his marriage to Mary, who carries a child from the Holy Spirit (v20). The Child will save his people from their sins, and is indeed "God with us."


Tues 1 John 3:1-5 God the Father has shown the greatest love in sending His own Son, who appeared in order to take away sins (v5). Through God's Son we have been cleansed of our sin, and brought into God's own family as "children of God" (v1,2). As such we surely do not desire to continue in sin, acting as though we were His enemy's children.

Wed Isaiah 9:6-7 The prophet reminds us that our joy at the Savior's birth is not our doing but God's (v7). The names by which He will be called show the Savior's character and work. His wisdom and power bring us to eternal peace. The everlasting nature of His kingdom was also emphasized to Mary by the angel Gabriel (Lk1:33).

Thurs Luke 2:25-32 Simeon, a devout seeker of the "consolation of Israel," is led by the Spirit to find that consolation in the child Jesus, now forty days old. Simeon praises God for preparing salvation for all people, both Gentiles and Israel (v30-32). Truly this means "a glad new year to all the earth!" (TLH85:15).

Fri 2 Corinthians 5:1-9 On the basis of God's salvation in Christ, Simeon was ready to depart this life in peace (Lk2:29). Similarly the apostle Paul looks forward to departing this life and being at home with the Lord (v8) after the "tent" of this earthly existence is exchanged for the "house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens" (v1).

Sat Isaiah 63:7-16 The prophet, having seen God's people rebel against the tender care and steadfast Fatherly love of the LORD, calls upon God to remember His compassion of old and how in His love and in His pity He redeemed them (v9). As we stand on the threshold of another new year, we also rejoice to remember the compassion and love of "our Redeemer from of old" (v16).
