## **Galatians 4:4-7**

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, <sup>5</sup> to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. <sup>6</sup> And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" <sup>7</sup> So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

## **Matthew 2:13-23**

Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." <sup>14</sup> And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt <sup>15</sup> and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt I called my son." <sup>16</sup> Then Herod, when he saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, became furious, and he sent and killed all the male children in Bethlehem and in all that region who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had ascertained from the wise men. <sup>17</sup> Then was fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet Jeremiah: <sup>18</sup> "A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be comforted, because they are no more." <sup>19</sup> But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, <sup>20</sup> saying, "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." <sup>21</sup> And he rose and took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. <sup>22</sup> But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. <sup>23</sup> And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, so that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, that he would be called a Nazarene.

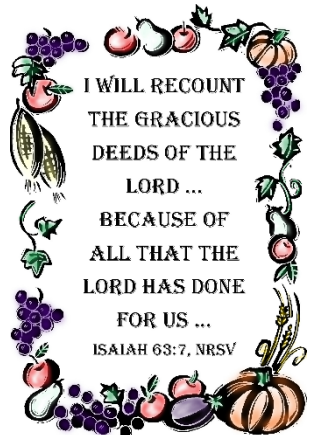

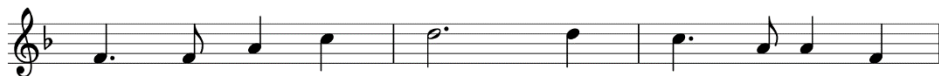

## “Counting the Days”

Are you counting the days? Maybe you’re “recounting” the days of the past year and reflecting on the ups and downs, the blessings and trials of 2022. Most of us, no doubt, are also looking ahead and counting the days, counting the days till school starts again, counting the days till a vacation trip, or crossing off the days on the calendar till a major life event such as a graduation or wedding. Here on earth we live in time. Everything we do is connected to it. We speak of wasted time, investing time, time flying, and the right time.

In Psalm 90:12 Moses too writes of time and counting days: *“Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.”* From our perspective time is an uncertain, arbitrary thing. We can count hours and days, but we don’t know how much we or anyone else has. We can’t foretell or see the future.

That is why Moses’ prayer is such a good one for us to offer this new year. We don’t know much about time or how to make the most of it, but God does. *“All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be”* (Ps. 139:16). Each day of this new year is an undeserved gift of God’s grace. What’s more, it’s not by chance that we are living in this place and time. God has put each of us here at this moment according to His good will and plan for us. He loves us too much to leave anything to coincidence or uncertainty. From God’s perspective, the biography of our lives is already completed and written. He knit us together in our mothers’ wombs. He sent His Son to rescue us from sin and death. He adopted us into His family by faith. Resurrection and eternal life are on the way.

What’s the best way to spend our earthly time? Ask the Lord daily for wisdom and look for the answer in His Word. He teaches us to seek first His kingdom and righteousness. Forgiveness, peace with Him, and eternal life are far more important than earthly things which don’t last. Knowing all is well between us and God through Jesus gives us a positive view of each new day and year. Paul urges us to make the most of our time: *“Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ”* (Eph. 5:20). Let’s count all our days as precious gifts to use for His glory!
