Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; June 05 - 10, '23

Mon Matthew 28:16-20 It is common in the world that people are born into their family name. Here Jesus sends His disciples into all the world to make disciples, baptizing them into another name, none other than the name of the Triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.


Tues Ephesians 1:3-10 Our human minds cannot fathom this information about God: that He is three separate persons, yet not three gods, but one God. He reveals this to us, however, to teach us about our salvation. God the Father chose us in Christ before the world began, and sent God the Son to redeem us by His blood. In Him we have forgiveness and eternal life!

Wed Ephesians 1:11-14 Continuing the thought of yesterdays' reading, while the Father sent the Son to save us, God the Holy Spirit brought us to hope in Christ, our Savior, assuring us by the Word that the promised heavenly inheritance is ours through Jesus even before the day when we will see it in person.

Thur Isaiah 6:1-8 The LORD of hosts is addressed as "Holy, Holy, Holy" (v3), reminding us that God is triune. It is He who called Isaiah to be His spokesman at a definite time in history, and prepared Him as He prepares all of His speakers: by cleansing them from their sins and by putting His Word in their mouths.

Fri 2 Corinthians 13:11-14 In closing his letter to the Corinthians, Paul urges them to live a life of peace and love, and points to the source of peace and love with the "apostolic benediction" (v14). The love, grace, and fellowship of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit brings about restoration, comfort, agreement, peace.

Sat Numbers 6:22-27 It is the LORD who made and preserves us. It is the LORD who graciously redeemed us by His blood. It is the LORD who gives us peace through the Word of forgiveness. When His name is put upon us (v27), in benediction or baptism (Mon. reading), the result is blessing!

I Believe in the Triune God

There is a legend about the ancient church father Augustine of Hippo and his desire to comprehend the Triune God. The story goes that he was walking down the beach contemplating the Trinity, when he saw a young boy running back and forth from the ocean carrying water in a shell and dumping the water into a small hole. Upon being asked what he was doing, the boy replied he was trying to "pour the entire ocean into this hole." Augustine informed the boy that it is impossible to fit the ocean into a tiny hole. The boy is supposed to have then responded, "And you cannot fit the Trinity in your tiny little brain."

While this may likely be only a legend, the lesson remains sage advice for us to heed. There is no way for us to comprehend everything about the Triune God while we are stuck in these earthly bodies. Moses declares, "The Lord is one," and yet at creation, God



says, "Let *Us* make man in *Our* image." There is one Jehovah God, yet He is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. How can this be? I do not know.

What I do know is that this Triune, All-Powerful God, has concerned Himself with me. The Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier of the world has coordinated all things together to ensure my salvation. And when God gives me the victory over death and raises me to be with Him, then "I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known." (1 Corinthians 13:12)


Confession of Faith The Athanasian Creed (Excerpts) The Athanasian Creed proclaims the Bible's teachings about the Trinity.

Whoever will be saved must hold to the true Christian faith. Now this is the Christian faith: We worship one God in three Persons and three Persons in one God, without mixing the Persons or dividing the Divine Being. For each Person – the Father, Son and Holy Spirit – is distinct, yet the Deity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, so is the Son and so is the Holy Spirit – infinite, eternal, almighty. So, the Father is God, the Son is God and the Holy Spirit is God—yet they are not three Gods, but one God. And within this Trinity none comes before or after; None is greater or inferior, but all three Persons are coequal and coeternal. Whoever will to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation to truly believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh. Now this is the true Christian faith: We believe and confess that our Lord
