Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had

directed them. ¹⁷ And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All

authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up,

and the train of His *robe* filled the temple. ² Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!" ⁴ And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵ So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The LORD of hosts." ⁶ Then one of the

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; August 14 - 21, '23

Mon Matthew 23:24-33 When Jesus says "Woe!" to the religious leaders who reject Him, it is not a curse but a lamentation. They are the ones bringing sorrow upon themselves and their followers by rejecting the One who creates clean hearts within and makes dead bones live through the prophetic word of forgiveness.

Tues Matthew 23:34-39 Although the religious leaders say they would not have killed the ancient prophets, they stand against the current prophets and the great Prophet who sends them. Jesus mourns for Jerusalem, whose children He wants to gather, but they refuse.

Wed Jeremiah 7:1-11 God sends the prophet Jeremiah to stand in the LORD's House and call people to reform their ways. Although they think they stand safely in the temple, their lives of self-service at the expense of the poor and the weak are not hidden from the LORD and show where their hearts truly are.

Thur Acts 20:17-21 Paul stops on his journey to say farewell to the elders of the church in Ephesus. He reminds them that, unlike false prophets who put on a good show, he had served the Lord among them in lowliness, tears, and trials, calling for repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Fri Acts 20:22-27 Paul has been warned by the Holy Spirit that chains and afflictions are ahead of him, but this news is not to have him turn away from Jerusalem. Rather he knows that the Lord will be with him and those trials will not stop him from testifying to the gospel of God's grace.

Sat Acts 20:28-38 Paul will not see these Ephesian elders again, and leaves them with a warning of trials that are ahead of them, both from "wolves" without and from false brothers within their group. In all that lies ahead, he commends them to God and to the word of His grace.
