

Judges 16:22-31

But the hair of his head began to grow again after it had been shaved. ²³ Now the lords


of the Philistines gathered to offer a great sacrifice to Dagon their god and to rejoice, and they said, "Our god has given Samson our enemy into our hand." ²⁴ And when the people saw him, they praised their god. For they said, "Our god has given our enemy into our hand, the ravager of our country, who has killed many of us." 25 And when their hearts were merry, they said, "Call Samson, that he may entertain us." So they called Samson out of the prison, and he entertained them. They made him stand between the pillars. ²⁶ And Samson said to the young man who held him by the hand, "Let me feel the pillars on which the house rests, that I may lean against them." ²⁷ Now the house was full of men and women. All the lords of the Philistines were there, and on the roof there were about 3,000 men and women, who looked on while Samson entertained. 28 Then Samson called to the LORD and said, "O Lord GOD, please remember me and please strengthen me only this once, O God, that I may be avenged on the Philistines for my two eyes." 29 And Samson grasped the two middle pillars on which the house rested, and he leaned his weight against them, his right hand on the one and his left hand on the other. 30 And Samson said, "Let me die with the Philistines." Then he bowed with all his strength, and the house fell upon the lords and upon all the people who were in it. So the dead whom he killed at his death were more than those whom he had killed during his life. 31 Then his brothers and all his family came down and took him and brought him up and buried him between Zorah and Eshtaol in the tomb of Manoah his father. He had judged Israel twenty years.

Romans 12:1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies

as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ² Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing

you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. ³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴ For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶ Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; ⁷ if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸ the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. ²² And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, "Far be it from you, Lord! This shall never happen to you." ²³ But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions

September 11 - September 16, '23

Mon John 5:1-9a A man at the pool of Bethesda has been afflicted by almost four decades of suffering, with no relief in sight. Jesus knows this and shows mercy greater even than the man's affliction. His healing enables the man at once to follow His Word, to take up his bed and walk.

Tues John 5:9b-14 Where Jesus shows mercy (yesterday's reading), others are more concerned about their rules for keeping the Sabbath. Jesus, who heals in order to help, not to gain fame, slips away into the crowd, but later reminds the man that it is to a new life (sin no more, v14) that he has been called.

Wed 1 Timothy 1:12-17 The apostle is full of thanksgiving for the mercy shown to him by the Lord Jesus. That Christ Jesus came into the world to save not the worthy, but sinners, blasphemers, persecutors, and violent people is nothing short of astonishing! To God be the glory!

Thur Psalm 50:14-20 The Lord speaks to His people in this Psalm, inviting their offerings and requests for help in the day of trouble. For those who recite the words but rely on sinful ways, He has sterner words.

Fri Psalm 50:21-23 Although God knows what the wicked are doing and will surely come in judgment, He still calls to them, and mercifully holds before them the salvation of God. Oh, that they might turn from their evil ways!

Sat 1 John 5:14-21 The fruit of God's mercy toward us is that we pray with confidence to Him, that we pray for one another, and that we avoid sinful ways. As Jesus told the man at Bethesda to sin no more (Jn5:14), so the apostle urges here: "Dear Children, guard yourselves from idols" (v21).
