
Tues 1 Thessalonians 5:14-24 As Jesus' works testified that He is the Christ (Jn10:25), so the works that God accomplishes in the sanctified lives of His believers also glorify the Son and the Father who sent Him.

Wed Psalm 39 As we approach the end of another year, we are reminded again of the brief time allotted to us in this life. Those suffering afflictions also face similar thoughts. In this short life, God's enduring goodness remains the source of our solid hope (v7).

Thur John 6:24-29 We have so much more to be thankful for than the food which spoils (v27). We also have Him on whom God has placed His seal of approval and who is worthy of our trust and thanks for all eternity.

Fri 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 The apostle calls upon us to show God's generosity toward us by being generous to others. Because His grace overflowed to us, it will overflow to others through us, resulting in the thanksgiving of many.

Sat Psalm 34:2-9 David invites us to proclaim the greatness of the LORD with him. That greatness consists in His being a Refuge at all times, and letting us taste His sweet deliverance. Thanks be to God!

Really there is only ONE Christmas. The Lord's advent ("coming") in the flesh to die for sin and set the world free from sin happened only once. And let's be thankful for that. As the days and years roll by, we see a life filled with distractions that take us away from a proper focus on God's righteous will. We sin every hour. Thanks be to God that He sent His Son in the flesh to rightly take our place and set us free from the guilt that burdens us – Once and for All. Because Jesus is the Son of God, there only needs to be ONE Christmas.

By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. ... But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God ... For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified. (Hebrews 10:10,12,14)

This ONE Christmas event is ours now as we believe what the Bible says – that this Man, the Son of God, has taken away all our sins. This isn't a gift that depends on us – neither is it lost by many sins, nor is it gained by our appreciation and works. God's in-flesh atonement is ONCE FOR ALL. What happened so long ago is yours today; it is yours throughout December; it is yours throughout all our life. - P What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?
- The words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that God gives forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation through the Sacrament.
- P For where there is forgiveness of sins,
- There is also life and salvation!
 - So who am I, That I should live and He should die, Under the rod. My God, my God, Why have You not forsaken me? Oh taste and see- the Lord is free.
- P How can eating and drinking do such wonderful things?
- Eating and drinking actually do nothing. It is the words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins" which do this.
- These words, together with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main part of the Sacrament.
- Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: forgiveness of sins.
 - In mouth and soul, He makes us whole-Christ, truly present in this meal.

 Oh, taste and see- the Lord is real.
- P When is one properly prepared to receive this Sacrament?
- Customs in connection with eating and clothing are indeed a fine preparation.
- P However, a person is truly worthy and well-prepared who has faith in these words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
- Whoever does not believe these words is unworthy and unprepared. The words, "for you," require nothing but believing hearts.
 - I s this for me? I am forgiven and set free!
 I do believe, That I receive,
 His very body and His blood.
 Oh, taste and see- the Lord is good.

The Nicene Creed



The Order of Holy Communion



- P Holy Communion is called the Lord's Supper, the Lord's Table, and the Sacrament of the Altar. What is the Sacrament of the Altar?
- It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us Christians under the bread and wine to eat and to drink, as it was instituted by Christ Himself.

"What Is This Bread?"

What is this bread? Christ's body risen from the dead:
This bread we break, This life we take,
Was crushed to pay for our release.
Oh, taste and see- the Lord is peace.

- P But where is this written?
- The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and the apostle Paul write this way:
- P "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and, when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, 'Take, eat. This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.'
- In the same way He took the cup, after supper, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying,
- P 'Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.'"
 - What is this wine? The blood of Jesus shed for mine; The cup of grace, Brings His embrace, Of life and love, And so I sing: Oh taste and see- The Lord is King.
