The Advent Wreath

The advent wreath is rich in symbolism, and as such it aids our worship as it reinforces our hope in the ultimate coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The wreath is covered with evergreen. Just as the species of tree is always green, so our hope for eternity is always alive because it rests upon the living Christ. The wreath is also in the form of a circle, which has no beginning and no end. What better way to picture that our life with God is everlasting.

The lighted candles are symbolic of the light of Christ and His Gospel, which alone can lift us out of our sin and spiritual darkness. The 4 candles surrounding the center candle remind us of the 4000 years of waiting for Christ by the Old Testament world. Each of the candles has been assigned a special name with special significance.

The Prophecy Candle is the 1st candle lit the first week in Advent. It is symbolic of the long years of waiting during which the prophets, inspired of God, kept alive the hope that the son of God was coming to redeem His people from their sins.

The Bethlehem Candle is the 2nd candle lit. It symbolizes the preparations being made for the coming of the Christ-child. The prophecy in Micah 5:2 that foretold Jesus' birthplace at Bethlehem may seem to be a minor revelation, but it shows how God prepared even the least detail for the coming of Christ.

The Shepherds' Candle is the 3rd candle lit and reminds us of our responsibility to share the Savior and His promises. The shepherds left their task and went with haste to see the Christchild, then they returned to tell others about the good news of the Savior.

The Angel's Candle is lit the 4th week of Advent. It reminds us of the activity of the angels before and after Jesus' birth, bearing messages, ministering, protecting, praising; they will be with Jesus at His final coming on Judgment Day, to gather the nations.

The Christ Candle is the center candle lit at the celebration of the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. Its white color symbolizes the perfect and holy life our Savior led on our behalf. With His death on the cross, the LORD now counts that white robe of Christ's righteousness to each one of us. God's great gift – His Son Jesus!

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions

December 18 - 23, 2023

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

-Psalm 119:105

Mon Isaiah 40:1-2 The Lord has double comfort, double forgiveness, for His people suffering exile in a foreign land. This shows both their great need and His great compassion.

Tues Isaiah 40:3-5 The Lord is going to come to take His exiled people back home. A voice in the wilderness urges all to get rid of anything that might hinder His coming and make a road for Him in the desert.

Wed Isaiah 40:6-8 The comfort which the Lord brings is not based on earthly situations, which change and fade like grass and flowers. No, His comfort is based on the eternal truths of God's Word.

Thurs Isaiah 40:9-10 Here is comfort that is worth proclaiming: "Here is your God!" He is stronger than any trouble, even death and hell. That He is "your" God means salvation for you!

Fri Romans 2:12-16 When Jesus comes again to judge, the secrets of people's hearts will be revealed. Then the righteousness which Christ has brought to us will be revealed as our greatest treasure.

Sat Matthew 3:1-12 John calls on all to repent and receive God's forgiveness in Christ. Matthew sees this as the greatest fulfillment of God's promised comfort in Isaiah 40, the paving of the way of the Lord in the wilderness.
