"Not Yet" . . . "Now!"

With Christmas, timing is everything. Remember in July when Christmas seemed so distant? Did you tell yourself at Thanksgiving that there was plenty of time to get cards sent and make travel plans? A few days ago the deadline passed for mailing packages. Are yours still waiting at home? Perhaps you mistimed a purchase online, and a gift now will be arriving after Christmas instead of before. Our timing is seldom perfect. Sometimes we procrastinate and put things off until it's too late. Other times we're too impatient to wait for the right time. Whether we're ready or not, the days and weeks go by with the regularity God ordered at creation. Without fail, the "not yet" of waiting and preparation turns into "now!"

God's timing in bringing about the first Christmas could not have been better. "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons" (Gal. 4:4-5). God was not going to be rushed. According to His perfect order, detail by detail, prophecy by prophecy, year by year, time moved along until "not yet" became "now!"

Christmas timing is much more than getting presents under the tree and guests in the house by December 25. At just the

one right moment in history, God's Son was born of the virgin Mary. His birth is a miracle beyond our rational understanding. He did not come merely to live here, but to lay down His holy life as a ransom payment for the debt of sin, your sin and mine.



The "not yet" of waiting, longing, and hoping becomes the "now," as we look forward to hearing the news of Christ's birth in our Christmas Eve service this afternoon. And just as Jesus came in the fullness of time, so in the fullness of time yet to come, He will return to transform the present "not yet" into a glorious eternal "now." "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." -Psalm 119:105

Mon Luke 2:1-7 In only seven verses, Luke recounts the birth of Jesus. This is no embellished legend, but an event set in history, naming rulers, places and participants. And the hand of God was guiding all.

Tues Luke 2:8-14 The Savior, Christ the Lord, was born for all, even shepherds out in the field. But if God had not let them (and us) know, we would all be in the dark about what He was doing for us.

Wed Luke 2:15-20 The great importance of Jesus' birth is shown by the shepherds who leave their flock to go and see God's gift, and then to become messengers themselves. With Mary may we ponder it all again and again.

Thur Hebrews 1:1-3 In the past God spoke through many messengers, but in these last days God spoke through His Son. Through Him God created and sustains the world. Through Him came purification for sins.

Fri Hebrews 1:4-6 The Son of God is far superior to every other messenger of God, yes, even heaven's angels! He is the One whom all the angels worship! (v6)

Sat Isaiah 9:6-7 The wondrous power and peace of the Christ-child is staggering, and cannot be over-emphasized! Through Him were all things made (Jn1:3). But the message that lifts our hearts to heaven is the "unto us," "unto us!" (v6). He is ours!
