"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." -Psalm 119:105

Mon John 21:15-17 The risen Lord brings restoration to Simon Peter. Peter, who so recently denied knowing Jesus, now finds comfort in the fact that Jesus knows (and forgives) him.


Tues John 21:18-24 Jesus indicates the kind of death by which Peter will glorify God. He can face such a death by following his risen Lord. The same Lord will also take care of John and the others in His own way.

Wed John 6:65-71 After Jesus' resurrection, how the disciples must have remembered all the times that He had prepared them for the suffering and triumph that lay ahead! He not only has the words of eternal life (v68), but He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life!

Thurs 1 John 4:1-6 The faith that the Spirit of God works in us is one that confesses that the human Jesus is the divine Messiah. This is what makes the difference between those from God and those from the world.

Fri 1 Peter 1:22-25 It is through the living and enduring word of God that we have been born again, purified through His forgiveness in Christ. His great love for us is reflected in our love for one another.

Sat Genesis 32:22-31 At a time of uncertainty in his life, Jacob seeks a blessing from God (v30) rather than from his own cleverness. His wrestling partner can dislocate with a mere touch, but blesses Jacob and gives him a new name: Israel.

Things Will Look Better in the Morning

At the end of an especially rough, discouraging day, someone may tell you, "Don't worry. Things will look better in the morning." Often they do. A good night's rest can put troubles into proper perspective. They may not be the disaster you had envisioned at the time.

It would be a huge understatement to say that Good Friday was a "rough day." God's Son was nailed to a cross. Jesus suffered the shame and indignity of a public execution. For hours He endured the pain and mocking. Even the heavenly Father turned His back on Him, and the entire world went dark. Finally, Jesus died, and with His death, hope died in the hearts of His disciples. They couldn't imagine anything more devastating and permanent.

Yet things would look better on Sunday morning. Jesus had told them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill him, and on the third day he will be raised to life" (Matt. 17:22-23). What appeared to be a terrible disaster was the means by which God would bring about the greatest blessing for humankind. Before He died, Jesus cried out, "It is finished!" and it was. Sin was paid for in full, and the world was reconciled to God. There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Things truly do look better in the light of Easter morning. No matter what troubles make a day discouraging, Jesus' resurrection is the assurance that God is not angry with us. We are His forgiven children in Christ. No matter how hard life may be, remember, Jesus lives to hear your prayers and will answer each one in love. When this life is wearisome and wears you down, look to the Easter dawn which is a preview of the resurrection and eternal life to come in the glory of heaven.

Even in the face of the most overwhelming enemies, the light of Easter shines through. Jesus lives! Therefore nothing can separate us from His love. Things really will look better in the morning! Ezekiel 37:1-14

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD

and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. ² And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. ³ And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." ⁴ Then he said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. ⁵ Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. ⁶ And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD." ⁷ So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone.⁸ And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. ⁹ Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live." ¹⁰ So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army.¹¹ Then he said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. Behold, they say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are indeed cut off.' 12 Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I will open your graves and raise you from your graves, O my people. And I will bring you into the land of Israel. ¹³ And you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O my people.¹⁴ And I will put my Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land. Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the LORD."

John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where

the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." ²⁴ Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have As His own servants we depart With His salvation in our heart. His saving power He has made known; His love through all the earth is shown.

Lord, let us show the world Your light; Let us declare Your glory bright, Proclaim Your death until You come To take Your ransomed servants home.

those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

1 Corinthians 15:12-22

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say

that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹³ But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised.¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. ¹⁵ We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified about God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. ¹⁶ For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁷ And if Christ has not been raised. your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. ¹⁸ Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished.¹⁹ If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied.²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.
